Industrial Action – next date 2 March

Thank you for your support and understanding about the industrial action that took place this term in many of our schools across the Trust. We really appreciate your messages expressing support, and recognise the challenges many of you faced in managing this.

The National Education Union and other education unions are continuing talks with the government to try to address the funding challenges schools are facing, as well as seeking a fully funded pay increase for staff, in line with inflation.

As I noted in my letter (18 January 2023), the NEU declared four days of strike action in our region of the country with the remaining dates being: Thursday 2 March 2023, Wednesday 15 March 2023 and Thursday 16 March 2023.

Schools will contact you a couple of days before each strike day to let you know which, if any, classes are affected and need to close, and will confirm on the morning of each planned strike day if additional classes are affected.

How does Governance work in our Trust?

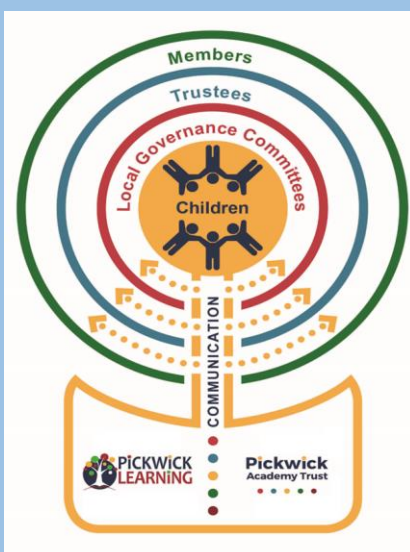
Starting at school level, with the children at the centre of everything we do, each school has a **Local Governance Committee** where governors have three core functions:

1. Ensuring the clarity of the school's vision, ethos and strategic direction, in line with the Trust vision
2. Holding the Head and senior leaders to account for the educational performance of the school and pupils
3. Providing support to monitor school expenditure

Next, we have a Board of **Trustees** who perform the roles above but focused at Trust level, holding the executive team to account for every school's educational and financial performance.

The final layer is our **Members** Group, whose role it is to oversee the operation of the Trust and hold the Trust Board to account.

All of these roles are performed by experienced and dedicated volunteers who give their time for free to support our work across the Trust. [Click](#) for more information on our governance.
