## Review of the year 2022-2023

As a Trust, we are always striving to improve and looking at what more we can do to support schools, but we wanted to take a moment to share some of our successes from 2022-23:

- Successfully transitioned Gillingham Primary School into the Trust as our first North Dorset school
- Embedded a range of new curriculum approaches
- Queens Crescent achieved a strongly Good Ofsted outcome
- Developed a new Environment Strategy, launched lots of eco-activities in schools and have plans in place for solar
- Strong school to school peer review process in place for staff and children, visiting each other's schools
- A range of sports, international, arts and eco-awards
- Launched a range of initiatives to support our most vulnerable learners and developed impactful case studies
- Parent, pupil and staff surveys to ask people's views

## Pupil Data Successes

We are hugely proud of everyone learning and working across the Trust, and our end of year pupil outcomes data is really strong.

Our combined Early Years (GLD) outcomes data for the Trust is 73%, and our Year 1 Phonics test outcomes were 83%, both significantly above national and Wiltshire figures.

Our Reading, Writing and Maths combined outcomes for Key Stage 1 are higher than both Wiltshire and national figures. At Key Stage 2, combined RWM outcomes are in line with national and higher than Wilts.

## Possible new schools joining Pickwick

Over the last 12 months, we have been talking with two schools in Salisbury and four schools in North Dorset about the possibility of joining the Pickwick family.

Alderbury & West Grimstead CE Primary and Longford CE Primary in South Wiltshire, and Milton on Stour CE Primary; St George's CE Primary, Bourton; St Gregory's CE Primary, Marnhull; and Wyke Primary in North Dorset are currently undertaking due diligence and consultations.

If all goes to plan, these schools will join us on 1 December 2023 and we will operate in three geographically proximate hubs.

## Sporting Prowess

## Pitton Teacher Wins Wiltshire Music Award

Last week, Mr Russell (class teacher and music lead at Pitton CE Primary) and Mrs Wilkinson (HT), attended the Wiltshire Music Education Awards where Mr Russell won the Wiltshire Digital Music Education Pioneer 2023 award. Mr Russell has worked with the children to create, write and record backing tracks and lyrics for their own songs uploading them to online platforms like Spotify. He has also led an after-school GarageBand club.



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
